

Access is digital.

In 2023, Lexington Public Library surpassed 1 million e-checkouts for the first time. Our elibrary received a total of 1,014,313 transactions, an 18% increase over 2022.

In 2023, our Virtual Services team...

- launched a new website, with 54,614 more visitors in 2023 than in 2022.
- introduced a digital library card that can be saved to customers' mobile wallet, issuing 957 digital library cards during the first 7 months of operation.
- migrated the library to a new and more robust program and room reservation software, with room reservations increasing by 53% from 2022 to 2023.

1,439 people used Book a Librarian to schedule a one-on-one consultation with a librarian. **49%** of individuals who booked an appointment needed help with technology, **16%** were seeking help with filling out forms, and **14%** were seeking resume assistance and/or job help.

The library expanded English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) programs in 2023, offering 27.75 hours of classes and conversation groups each week. Students in these classes were from over 20 different countries, and they reported that their overall quality of life improved after regularly attending these programs.



SUMMER AT THE LIBRARY

The library hosted a record-breaking 805 programs in summer 2023. We also served 1993 hot meals throughout the summer in partnership with Fayette County Public Schools.


