Retirement Assets

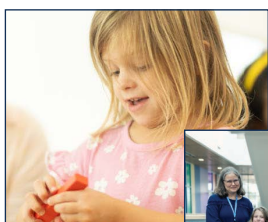
IRAs and 401(k)s may be heavily taxed when inherited. Ask your account custodian for a beneficiary designation form to name Lexington Public Library Foundation.

Life Insurance

Lexington Public Library Foundation can be named as the sole, partial or contingent beneficiary of a policy. This may translate into a large gift (and tax deduction) with little cost to you.

Investment Assets
